St Maria Goretti Life History

St Maria Goretti was the third born out of seven children of peasant farmers Luigi Goretti and Assunta Carlini. Her siblings were Alessandro (Sandrino), Antonio (who died in infancy), Angelo, Maria, Ersilia, Mariano (Marino), and Teresa. When Maria Goretti was around five years, they gave up their land due to piling debts and poverty and moved away to work for other farmers. They moved to several places in search of a fortune. First, in 1896 they went to Colle Gianturco, near Paliano and Frosinone and then in 1899 they went to Le Ferriere and Nettuno in Lazio.

In Nettuno, they lived in a building called "La Cascina Antica," where they shared with the family of Giovanni Serenelli and his son, Alessandro. When she was nine years old, Maria Goretti's father died of malaria. Thereafter, her mother and other siblings would work in the fields, while she stayed at home cooking, sewing, keeping the house clean, and watching Teresa, her young sister.

Murder by Alessandro Serenelli

One fateful day on The 5th July 1902, Maria Goretti was watching her sister Teresa and sewing a shirt while sitting on the outside steps of her home. The housemate's son, Alessandro, knowing very well she would be alone, came back home early from the farm, pulled her to her bedroom, and made sexual advances towards her. It was not the first attempt, he had made two others and got rejected. Maria would hear none of it, she vehemently protested and rejected Alessandro's advances and told him that what he wanted to do was a mortal sin and warned him that he would go to Hell. When he insisted on raping her, she kept screaming, "No! It is a sin! God does not want it!" Alessandro began to choke her, but she told him she would rather die than give in to his demands. Therefore, Alessandro got angry, brandished a 10-inch awl, and stabbed her eleven times. Maria Goretti tried to escape but upon reaching the door he stabbed her three more times and ran away. During this incident, Teresa was asleep. She was awakened by the noise of her wailing sister Maria. She started crying loudly until her mother Assunta and Giovanni came to check out what the issue was. They found Maria Goretti bleeding on the floor and rushed her to the hospital in Nettuno. She endured the pain during the surgery because it was without anesthesia. During

the surgery, the physician told her, "Maria, think of me in Paradise." She replied. "I will gladly think of you." She also forgave Alessandro saying that she wished that he would also go to Heaven with her and thereafter died of the injuries.

One afternoon, Alessandro, the Serenellis' son, made sexual advances to her. When she refused to submit to him, he stabbed her fourteen times.

Alessandro Serenelli was arrested immediately after stabbing Maria and running away. In court, he was sentenced to life imprisonment, but the sentence was reduced to 30 years because;

- He was a minor at that time
- He was not as mature as he was expected to be for a 20-year-old
- He grew up in a poor family with an alcoholic father and several of his kins suffering from madness.

Alessandro remained unrepentant and said the reason he stabbed her was Maria Goretti's refusal to give in and her desperate crying.

One time, Monsignor Giovanni Blandini, the local bishop, visited him in prison. He told him about a dream in which Maria Goretti appeared to him in a white dress, she gathered lilies in a garden and with a smile gave him the flowers. After he took each lily, it turned into a white flame.

After Alessandro Serenelli was released he visited Assunta, Maria's mother, and begged for forgiveness. She outrightly forgave him and received the Holy Communion together side by side when they attended Mass together the following day.

Alessandro joined the Order of Friars Minor Capuchin and became a lay brother. He lived in the monastery and worked as a gardener and receptionist until he died at age 87 in 1970.

In 1950, he attended her canonization, and thereafter, it is reported that he would pray to her every day referring to her as "my little saint."

Beatification

Maria Goretti was beatified on the 27th Of April 1947 by Pope Pius XII in Rome Italy. Her mother Assunta attended the ceremony. Pope Pius XII said to her, "Blessed mother, happy mother, mother of a Blessed!"

Canonization

With her mother Assunta, her siblings, and Alessandro in attendance, Maria Goretti was canonized as a saint on June 24 1950 by Pope Pius XII in Rome three years after her beatification. She became one of the youngest saints to be canonized. Pope Pius XII referred to her as "Saint Agnes of the 20th century."

There was a very large number of Christians present, around 500,000 people, and therefore, the canonization ceremony was held outside Saint Peter's Basilica, in St. Peter's Square (Piazza San Pietro).

Relics

The remains of St Maria Goretti are interred in the crypt of the Passionist Basilica of Nostra Signora delle Grazie e Santa Maria Goretti in Nettuno, Rome.
